WHERE THE WORLD OPENS UP

The Accountability Pillar surveys are administered annually and throughout the province, during the months of January to March to:

- Students in Grades 4, 7 and 10;
- Students in Grades 4 through 9 (in small schools);
- Parents of students in Grades 4, 7 and 10; and
- Teachers.

Students and teachers complete the surveys online at school while parents receive a copy of the survey that can be completed online, or by mail. Parent surveys are returned directly to Alberta Education.

Responses are collected and tabulated into a summary chart released in May and are updated in October to supplement updated academic achievement results through the Provincial Achievement Tests (grade 6 and 9) and the Diploma Examination results (Divisional and First Nations, Métis and Inuit specific). These achievement reports are provided in a separate summary report on our school's website.

This Accountability Pillar Results Report includes our school's overall summary and new results for all survey measures.

Approximate Survey Responses:

- 23 parents in our school responded to the survey. This is up from 18 last year. Unfortunately, low survey responses may not accurately represent our parent population.
- In Parkland School Division, approximately 459 parents responded to the survey. The five-year average for parent responses is approximately 406.
- In Parkland School Division: 2,560 Students (960 in grades 4-6, 700 in 7-9 and 900 in 10-12) responded; this included 92 students who responded from our school.
- In Parkland School Division, 457 teachers responded; this included 42 teachers from our school.

These are approximate numbers as not every respondent answers every question.

Highlights and Celebrations

École Broxton Park School continues to celebrate the strong work of staff, students and our overall community.

École Broxton Park School experienced growth in all Accountability Measures this year. As a school, we have been focusing on Parkland Schools Division's Mission, Vision and Values and finding ways to increase and diversify our programming to meet the needs of all of students and their families.
We celebrate programming through our Fusion Friends, our Fusion Assemblies and our teachers' commitment to working collaboratively to build capacity, support growth and build student success.

• École Broxton Park School had a 41.7% increase in our teachers and parents' satisfaction that students demonstrate the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary for life-long learning. There was also a 26.4% increase in teachers and parents who agree that students are taught attitudes and behaviours that will make them successful at work when they finish school. These increases can be attributed to a commitment from staff to make learning visible and connected to the world we live in. Our Grade four students had a letter writing pen pal with professionals in their interested fields. Our Grade sevens attended the SKILLS competition, where they observed and attempted various careers. École Broxton Park's Health Days, have established a partnership with Junior Achievement which has led to hands on experience and conversations for students with people directly linked to a variety of career fields.

Parkland School Division's Ultimate Goal is Student Success and Well-Being. To this end, the Board's current Education Plan targets nine assurance elements in student growth, teaching and leading and learning supports.

There are still some areas for growth within our Accountability Pillar Survey results. École Broxton Park School is committed to improvement and continuing to learn and grow with our community. Areas Requiring Strategic Planning

École Broxton Park School has been working for the last few years in developing a strong culture of growth mindset and continual improvement. We are seeing these efforts begin to support our students and their families, through a growth of 20.1% where teachers, parents and students indicate that their school and schools in jurisdiction have improved or stayed the same the last three years. We witnessed a 19.9% increase in teacher, parent and students' satisfied with the accessibility, effectiveness and efficiency of programs and services for students in their community. These two measures will still be a focus in the up and coming years, looking specifically at our ability to build capacity and responsiveness to emergent situations and needs.
